Whereupon, he prayed a legal distribution of the estate. The cause was submitted to the decision of the judge of the County Court, under an agreed statement of facts, which was in the following words: Ve agree that the property referred to belonged to Thomas Murphy, W110 died at the time stated in the petition, leaving his widow, Frances J.
